



Box Office

Compared to the record-breaking year of 2018, 2019 was a fairly weak year at the Box Office for Norwegian Cinema. However, almost every fifth ticket sold at the Cinema were for a Norwegian film and the market share for Norwegian film remains slightly above the EU average.


Admissions to Norwegian films at the cinema 2015-2019

Norwegian Market Share






Largest domestic market shares within the EU, 2019

Number of releases

2019 saw the release of 21 Norwegian feature films, inculding four documentaries, and five titles for children. Among the 21 released films 14 had received production funding from the Norwegian Film Institute, including the seven films with the highest admissions numbers.

Digital platforms


The vast majority of Norwegian film, released within the last five years, are available on a digital platform. While there is still room for improvement in the availability of Norwegian film on SVOD-services, we have seen an increase from close to every fifth to every third Norwegian film being available on such a service over the last three years.

2019 saw a slight decline in the market share for orwegian film on VOD-services, while Norwegian drama series saw a substantial increase.

Female share

The female share of key staff* among projects that received production funding from NFI (for all formats) was 52% in 2019, slightly *above* NFI's targeted long-term goal at 50 percent.

As this figure relates to year of funding some lag when comparing the figures with the female share of key staff among feature length films released is to be expected.

In 2019 the female share among released films that received no funding was in fact higher than the films with production funding from NFI.



Funding

NFI administers several subsidy schemes. The commissioner scheme for artistically rated films, drama series, short films and video games, the market scheme targeted towards films with broad audience appeal, a minority Co-production scheme, and the New Ways scheme targeted towards innovative low budget

projects with a large degree of creative freedom for the directors and producers involved. NFI funding also includes box office support for films that obtain certain criteria, regardless of whether they have received earlier funding from NFI. In total, the NFI granted over 486 million NOK to the above-mentioned schemes.

Financing

Norwegian drama series has grown hugely in popularity, aligning with the rise of streaming services in the last few years. As such it is not surprising that drama series has the largest average budgets when comparing formats. As the numbers show, NFI remains a large and important, quite often the largest, source of financing for Norwegian film projects.

Feature films remain the largest recipient of project funding, with 53 % of the total project funding being given to feature film projects. The distribution of funds by format in 2018 was closely aligned to the average distribution over the last five years.

As such the schemes are designed to provide access to quality films for children and adults alike in cinema and other viewing platforms, as well as providing education on film history and expanding audiences knowledge of Norwegian and foreign film.
